

RoHS delivery declaration – Directive 2011/65/EU

Legal basis in the European Union (EU)

The directive on the restriction of the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment 2011/65/EU (RoHS Directive) was published in the Official Journal of the European Union, L 174, on 1 July 2011. It came into force on 21 July 2011 and replaces the previous directive 2002/95/EC and all related amending directives.

Legal basis in Germany

The RoHS Directive is implemented in German law in the "Verordnung zur Beschränkung der Verwendung gefährlicher Stoffe in Elektro- und Elektronikgeräten" (ElektroStoffV) dated 19.04.2013.

The implementation of this law has been obligatory for German businesses since 9 May 2013.

Along with the RoHS Directive, Directive 2012/19/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council on waste electrical and electronic equipment (so-called WEEE Directive) regulates the legal basis in the EU for the disposal of waste electrical and electronic equipment. It came into force on 13 August 2012.

Both directives are aimed at the prudent and rational utilisation of natural resources and are intended to increase the recycling of waste electrical and electronic equipment.

A corresponding declaration will be given for exceptions in the specific case.
